The JPP encourages families to become and stay more involved with PCA as well as strengthening a long-term connection between the 16/17-year old sons and daughters of PCA members and their future involvement in the club.

The JPP allows the fully licensed **sons and daughters (notice, not nephews or nieces or stepchildren) of PCA members** to participate in autocross, autocross school, rally, gymkhana, concours and tech quiz.

Participation in rallies shall be limited to a role as navigator (not driver). Autocross, Autocross School, Rally, Gymkhana, Concours and Tech Quiz guidelines are described in the current year Region Procedures Manual (RPM) and Parade Competition Rules (PCR) books.

Use of Forms:

Parental Consent, Release and Waiver of Liability, Assumption of Risk, and Indemnity Agreement

You must have **both parents** sign this form. Each may witness the other's signature. If one parent is deceased, the living parent must so state on the form, and have his or her signature witnessed by a different person. If you have any reason to doubt that the other parent is deceased, you should not simply rely upon the representation. This form must be filed in the Region's archives.

Although this form may be used for more than one event, it must specifically list all events in which the 16/17 year old son or daughter will participate. You should check the form before each event in which the JPP driver is planning to participate, to make sure that the form lists the event. If the event is not listed, then both parents must sign another form for the event. It would be wise to advise the JPP driver to keep a copy for their records also.

Minor's Assumption of Risk Acknowledgment

This form must be signed and witnessed at the event. This form must also be filed with the completed insurance waiver forms. Additionally, a copy of this completed form must be stored in the region's archives.

Rules for the Junior Participation Program:

1. JPP Drivers must hold a valid, full privilege Driver's License in their state of residence. If there are state-imposed conditions placed upon the Driver's License (e.g. corrective lenses, no passengers below a certain age, etc.), such conditions must be complied with in addition to all PCA guidelines.
2. JPP Drivers must present their license at time of registration for events involving moving cars.
3. At least one parent of the JPP Driver must be on premises during the time the JPP Driver is actively participating in the event.
4. The parent of the JPP Driver must present both forms at time of registration to the Event Chairman, Event Registrar or Region President.
5. All participants and event organizers must adhere to all the insurance regulations as well as the guidelines dictated in the PCA Guidelines for Autocross, Rally and Track included in the RPM.
6. Forms must be handled as stated in this letter.

Checklist of Key Points:

- Is the proposed 16/17 year old driver a son or daughter of a current PCA member?
- Does the 16/17 year old driver possess a valid, full privilege driver's license (other than restrictions which are being complied with) issued by a state?
- Is the event one an autocross, autocross school, rally, gymkhana, concours or tech quiz?
- Have both parents signed the Parental Consent, Release and Waiver of Liability, Assumption of Risk, and Indemnity Agreement?
- Are both parents' signatures witnessed?
- If only one signature appears on the Parental Consent, Release and Waiver of Liability, Assumption of Risk, and Indemnity Agreement, does the parent represent that the other parent is deceased? If so, and if you have no reason to doubt that representation, check to make sure that the single parent's signature is witnessed.
- Is the event specifically listed on the Parental Consent, Release and Waiver of Liability, Assumption of Risk, and Indemnity Agreement?
- Has the 16/17 year old driver signed the Minor's Assumption of Risk Acknowledgment?
- Is the event specifically listed on the Minor's Assumption of Risk Acknowledgment?

- Is at least one parent present at the event at all times in which there are moving cars?

If the answers to any of the questions above is NO, then you may not allow the 16/17 year old driver to participate in the event.

I know that these Risks and dangers may be caused by my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the event(s), the rules of the event(s), the condition and layout of the premises and equipment, or the negligence of others, including those persons responsible for conducting the event(s).

I HAVE READ THE ABOVE ASSUMPTION OF RISK ACKNOWLEDGMENT, UNDERSTAND WHAT I HAVE READ, AND SIGN IT VOLUNTARILY.
